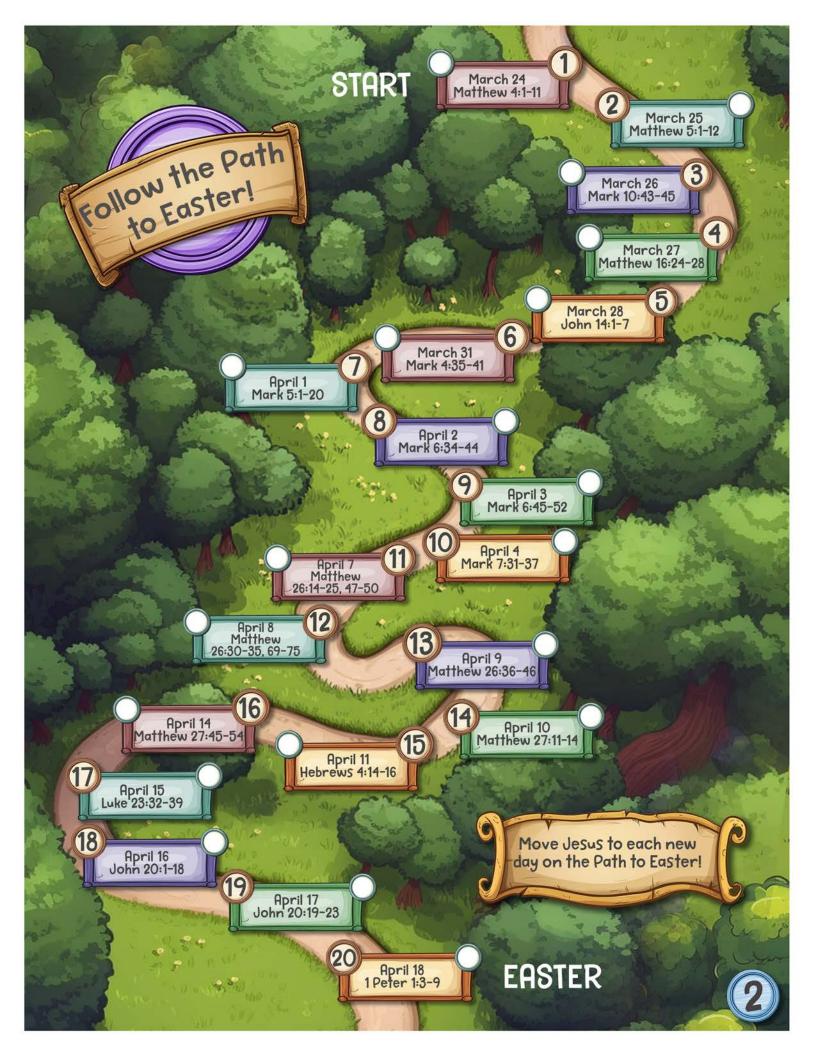

MARCH 24: READ MATTHEW 4:1-11

REFLECT

- 1. With whom is Jesus speaking?
- 2. What is Jesus quoting in his responses when He says, "It is written"?

RESPOND

Where does your heart feel unsettled? Share with an adult in your family and pray together that God would show you a truth that would help calm you.

MARCH 25: READ MATTHEW 5:1-12

REFLECT

- 1. What word is repeated 9 times in this passage?
- 2. What do you notice about the people Jesus describes in this passage?

MARCH	26:	READ	MARK	10:43-	45
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REFLECT

- 1. How does Jesus say we can become great?
- 2. What did the Son of Man (Jesus) come to do?

RESPOND

Place your hands on your stomach. Do the following:

Breathe in for 3 counts and say to yourself, "Jesus, you are great..."

Breathe out for 4 counts and say to yourself, "...! want to serve like you."

MARCH 27: READ MATTHEW 16:24-28

REFLECT

- 1. What does it mean (vs 24) to deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow Jesus?
- 2. What is it that Jesus knew and His disciples did not yet understand?

RESPOND - Journal about a time when you know the Holy Spirit helped you make the right decision.
Sometimes even though we want to make a bad choice, the Holy Spirit leads us to make a good
choice. Write about it below.

MARCH 28: READ JOHN 14:1-7

REFLECT

- 1. This is Jesus' last night with His friends before He goes to the cross. Why would their hearts be troubled?
- 2. Jesus is described as the ______ in verse 6.

RESPOND

Declaring the Word of God over our lives reminds us who we are.

Take some unhurried time to read through the following truths column and how it goes against the lie column. Say the truths out loud.

LIES TRUTH

APRIL 1: READ MARK 5:1-20

REFLECT

- 1. Describe the man's life before he encounters Jesus.
- 2. Jesus acts calmly even when the situation is chaotic. How does the way Jesus acts affect the man?

RESPOND

Place your hands on your stomach. Do the following:

Breathe in for 3 counts and say to yourself, "Jesus, when I am afraid..."

Breathe out for 4 counts and say to yourself, "...I put my trust in you."

APRIL 2: READ MARK 6:34-44

REFLECT

- 1. What did the people not have? And how many people were there?
- 2. How did the disciples express their worry in response to this need? Also, describe how Jesus acted calmly.

REFLECT

- 2. What are Jesus' words in verse 50? How do you feel when you read them?

RESPOND

Act out this story with your family members. Play different parts of the story.

APRIL 4: READ MARK 7:31-37

REFLECT

- 1. What do you think life was like for a deaf and speech-impaired man in Bible times?
- 2. What did Jesus do for the man? And for his friends?

APRIL 7: READ MATTHEW 26:14-25, 47-50

REFLECT

- 1. What do you learn about Judas and how he betrays Jesus from these verses?
- 2. What stands out to you about Jesus' attitude in these interactions?

RESPOND

How have you ever had a friend hurt your feelings? Think of a time when that happened. And spend a minute praying for them. God wants you to experience calm and healing even when friendships are hard.

APRIL 8: READ MATTHEW 26:30-35, 69-75

REFLECT

- 1. Read verse 32 again. Jesus stays calm when His friends betray Him because he knows on Sunday morning. He will _____ from the dead.
- 2. Peter is one of Jesus' best friends. How does Peter's reaction in verse 75 show us this?

RESPOND

Place your hands on your stomach. Do the following:

Breathe in for 3 counts and say to yourself, "Even when friendships are hard..."

Breathe out for 4 counts and say to yourself, "...I am a friend of God."

APRIL 9: READ MATTHEW 26:36-46

REFLECT

- 1. What are the disciples doing in this passage? What is Jesus doing?
- 2. What feelings did Jesus experience while he was praying in the Garden of Gethsemane?

RESPOND - Write a prayer praising Jesus for obeying His Father even when it was difficult so we could be saved!

APRIL 10: READ MATTHEW 27:11-14

REFLECT

- 1. How did Jesus respond to the political and religious leaders when He was on trial?
- 2. Why do you think Jesus did not feel the need to defend Himself?

RESPOND

APRIL 15: READ LUKE 23:32-39

REFLECT

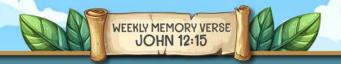
- What does Jesus say from the cross in this passage?

RESPOND

Think about someone you need to forgive. Maybe they hurt your feelings or did something to you that was mean. Ask Jesus to help you forgive them. Jesus forgives anyone who asks for it.

APRIL 16: READ JOHN 20:1-18

REFLECT

- 1. Why is Mary so upset?
- 2. How do her feelings change when she interacts with Jesus?

RESPOND

Using some toys or things from nature, set this scene up. You could have a tree and Lego people. You could use materials from nature (with parent permission). You could have people and angels. Recount with your family what is happening in this part of the story.

REFLECT

- 1. How are the disciples feeling at the beginning of the passage?
- 2. What phrase does Jesus use two times in this passage? Write it here:

RESPOND

Then tape it up (with your parent's permission) in a place you'll see it (bathroom mirror, near your bed, bedroom door), so you can see it regularly.
