EASTER

WEEK ONE

Jesus, the Man Who Suffered Like Us

DAY 1 MARCH 16: READ MATTHEW 26:36-46

REFLECT

1. What did Jesus go to do in the Garden of Gethsemane?
2. Based on what you read, what do you learn about Jesus' emotions while he was in the Garden?

RESPOND

Spend a few minutes praying. It's easy to pray! You can close your eyes (so you're not distracted) and just talk to God. Some people start their prayers with "Dear God". And you can end your prayer with the word, "Amen!" Which means "Let it be so." Prayer is something people practice doing, so you can try it, too!

DAY 2 MARCH 17: READ ISAIAH 53

Parents: This chapter has a lot of language that might be considered graphic. Consider reading verses 1-5 with your younger kids. Not all of the Biblical text is "kid-friendly," but it all points to Jesus!

REFLECT

1. Isaiah is a book in the Old Testament, but he wrote prophetically about Jesus! Jesus is the one Isaiah is writing about in this chapter. In verses 1-5, what do you learn about Jesus' appearance?
2. All that Jesus went through (piercing, crushing, chastisement) brought us what? (verse 5)

RESPOND

Spend a few minutes praying as a family for people you know who are sick. They might have bodies that are sick. Or they might not yet know Jesus, and their soul is sick. We believe in a God who can heal bodies and souls!

WEEK ONE

Jesus, the Man Who Suffered Like Us

DAY 3 MARCH 18: READ PSALM 75

REFLECT

1. On day 1, we read that Jesus prayed that the _____ (3 letter word) would pass from him. Psalm 75 shows us that this was the cup of God's judgment.
2. Read Psalm 75, verses 8-10 in the New Living Translation. Who drinks the cup? Whose power is increased?

RESPOND

Write out 3 things you can thank God for today!

DAY 4 MARCH 19: READ HEBREWS 2:14-18

REFLECT

1. What do you think it was like for Jesus to live in a human body?
2. How does it help your heart to know that Jesus understands the hard things we face?

RESPOND

Tell Jesus where you need help today. He understands and wants to help.

WEEK ONE

DAY 5 MARCH 19: READ HEBREWS 4:14-16

REFLECT

1. Write down everything you learn about the great high priest in this passage.

2. Fill in the table below from the verses:

What Jesus Does (v. 14-15)	What We Get (v. 16)

RESPOND

Draw a picture of how you imagine God's throne. He is the king in charge of the whole world, and because of Jesus, we can ask for his help.

WEEK TWO

Jesus, the Mediator who Fulfilled the Law for Us

DAY 6 MARCH 23: READ MATTHEW 26:57-67

REFLECT

1. What is Jesus accused of saying?
2. Where will they “now see the Son of Man”?

RESPOND

Using some blocks, build a temple, remembering that Jesus didn't destroy the temple; he became the temple, which is the place where God dwelt in a special way!

DAY 7 MARCH 24: READ JEREMIAH 31:31-34

REFLECT

1. What is the new covenant that the Lord will make with his people? (see verse 33)
2. Why do you think the law is put within the people and written on their hearts?

RESPOND

With parental help, cut a heart out of a sheet of paper. Tape it up where you can see it as a reminder that this is where God writes his law!

WEEK TWO

Jesus, the Mediator who Fulfilled the Law for Us

DAY 8 MARCH 25: READ ROMANS 8:1-4

REFLECT

DAY 9 MARCH 26: READ GALATIANS 3:10-14

REFLECT

1. What did Christ do for us (vs 13)?

2. What do we receive because Jesus died on the cross? *Hint: It fits into the blanks below:*

RESPOND

Let's do a science experiment! With your parents' help, get a paper towel, a tarnished penny, some salt, and a bowl of vinegar. First, try to clean the penny with just the paper towel. If that doesn't work (😊), mix the salt and the vinegar together in a bowl. Drop the penny in and wait 30 seconds to a minute. Now, try to clean the penny! The law will never clean us. Jesus is the one who cleanses us!

WEEK TWO

Jesus, the Mediator who Fulfilled the Law for Us

DAY 10 MARCH 27: READ HEBREWS 10:1-4, 11-20

REFLECT

1. In the Old Testament, God instructed his people to make sacrifices as a payment for their sins, but what do you learn in verse 4 about bulls and goats?

2. Looking at verse 14, what do you learn about Jesus' sacrifice?

RESPOND

Write down Hebrews 10:12 on the lines below and thank God for what you write!

WEEK THREE

Jesus, the Messiah who Saved Us

DAY 11 MARCH 30: READ LUKE 23:32-33, 39-43

REFLECT

1. Compare and contrast how each criminal on the cross acted.
Circle how the first one acted. Box how the second one acted.

Wanted to “be with” Jesus forever.

Made fun of Jesus.

Only wanted to “get down” from the cross.

Believed Jesus was a King.

Asked Jesus for help.

Didn't believe who Jesus was.

2. What does Jesus tell the second criminal? _____

The same can be true for you! Trusting Jesus as your Savior means you will be _____ him forever.

RESPOND

On a separate sheet of paper and draw a picture of what you think it means for Jesus to be with you. Think about when you go to school or when you play outside, or maybe a time when you have been scared.

DAY 12 MARCH 31: READ MATTHEW 9:9-13

REFLECT

1. According to this passage, with whom does Jesus spend his time?
2. Why did he choose to spend time with these people (vs 12-13)?

RESPOND

Journal (or talk about with your family) the answer to this question: Can you think of a time when it was hard to show "mercy" (being extra kind) to someone who wasn't being nice? How does knowing Jesus loves us help us be kind to them anyway?

WEEK THREE

Jesus, the Messiah who Saved Us

DAY 13 APRIL 1: READ 1 CORINTHIANS 1:18-24

REFLECT

1. Just like the two criminals we studied on Day 11 had two different views of Jesus, what two groups of people are mentioned in this passage?
2. In verse 24, what are two ways Christ is described?

RESPOND

Imagine you are looking at a giant puzzle piece that is solid black. You might think, *"This is an ugly, dark puzzle."* But when you zoom out and see the whole 1,000-piece picture, you realize that the black piece is actually the pupil of a beautiful eye or a shadow in a sunset. You could try this by looking at one small piece of a puzzle you own and then putting the puzzle together. Though Jesus' death on the cross seemed foolish, it actually was how God saves the world!

DAY 14 APRIL 2: READ TITUS 3:3-7

REFLECT

1. List out how people who don't know Christ act before they know him.
2. Why did God save us? Look at verse 5 and fill in the blanks. It was not because of _____, but because of _____.

RESPOND

Pour yourself (or have your parents help you) two glasses of your favorite drink. In one glass, put a tiny bit. In the second glass, put a big ole serving! That second glass represents God pouring out the Holy Spirit on us. He is so generous in the salvation He gives us!

WEEK THREE

Jesus, the Messiah who Saved Us

DAY 15 APRIL 3: READ 1 PETER 2:22-25

REFLECT

1. How did Jesus act when he suffered?
2. What animal are people compared to? And who helps this animal?

RESPOND

Pray the following prayer:

Dear Jesus,

Thank You for being the Great Shepherd who loves me and watches over me. Your Word says that You never made a mistake and never said an unkind word, but You still went to the cross for me.

I am sorry for the times I have been like a wandering sheep, going my own way and making wrong choices. Thank You for carrying all my sins in Your body on the cross so that I could be forgiven. By Your wounds, my heart is healed.

This Easter, I celebrate that You didn't stay in the grave! You rose again to lead me and give me a brand new life. I want to stop wandering and follow Your footsteps. Please be my Shepherd forever, wash my heart clean, and help me to live for what is right. In Jesus' name.

Amen.
